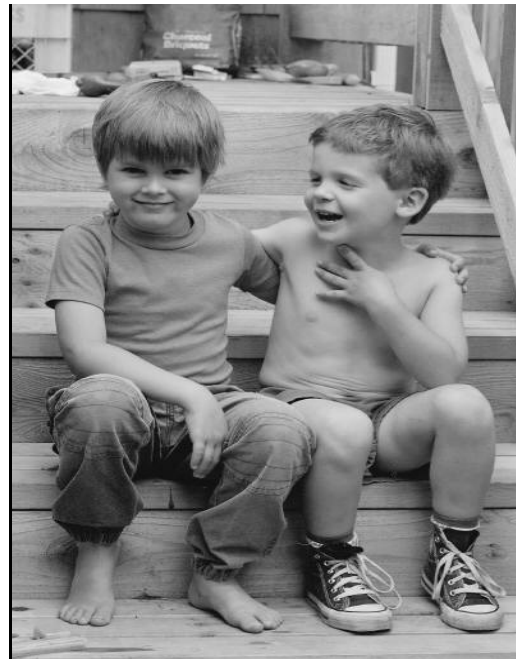

This Week's Program: Program Chairman, **Phil England** will introduce our guest speaker, **Sallie Parks**. A resident of Pinellas County for 44 years, she currently has a consulting company which concentrates on non-profit companies undergoing change. In 1992, she was elected to the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners, serving as chairman for 2 of her 8 years on the board. Her community involvement through the years has been extensive, working with Tampa Bay Water, Pinellas County Arts Council, Mease Health Care, the AvMed Community Advisory Board, Dunedin Fine Art Center Advisory Board, the Clothes to Kids Community Advisory Board, Old Palm Harbor Main Street, Clearwater Arts Foundation and WorkNet Pinellas, League of Women Voters of North Pinellas County, the American Heart Association, Leadership Pinellas Alumni, Audubon Society, and the Florida Botanical Gardens Foundation.



A long time member of the Rotary Club of Dunedin, she served as their president in 2003-04. In recognition of the 100th Anniversary, more than \$200,000 was raised by the two Dunedin Rotary Clubs to build a centennial legacy, an environmental education center at Honeymoon Island State Parks, which opened in May, 2007. Appointed by Governor Jeb Bush in 2006 to the Governing Board of the Southwest Florida Water Management District, Sallie is chairman of the Regulation Committee. She also serves as co-chair ex officio for the Pinellas-Anclote Basin Board and represents the District on the Tampa Bay Estuary Program's Board of Directors. She will talk today about water issues and SWFWMD.

Sallie is a graduate of Central Michigan University and Michigan State University. She is married to a retired minister, has five adult children, eleven grandchildren and has raised five foster children.

Last Week's Program: President, **Phil England** introduced **Kathryn Oravec**. **Katie** presented information on the **Criminal Justice Academy** located at **Pinellas Park High School**. She is currently beginning her third year as the Counselor for the **Criminal Justice Academy**. The first accredited program of its kind in the State of Florida, the Academy began in 1996 and is offered to students whose behavior is excellent and who maintain a 2.5 GPA. Each August, a lottery is held if there are more applicants than spaces available. They currently have 450 students in the program. Freshmen are introduced to basic police work, simulated fire-arms training and the basics of the Criminal Justice System. Sophomores conduct mock trials in an actual courthouse setting at the school.



They study Capital Punishment not only in our country, but also how other countries around the world implement their Capital Punishments. Juniors learn about Comprehensive Law, Family Court, Adoption and Divorce proceedings. They also participate in two mock trials during the school year. Senior year is a technical Forensic Year. Seniors learn how to collect shoe prints, fingerprints and crime scene information. The Seniors have a room designed as a crime scene apartment where they set up clues and then bring in the Freshmen and help them figure out "Who Did It". The program gives students experience in Speech, Debate and Courtroom Procedures. For more information on their program, Katie can be reached at Pinellas Park High School.
