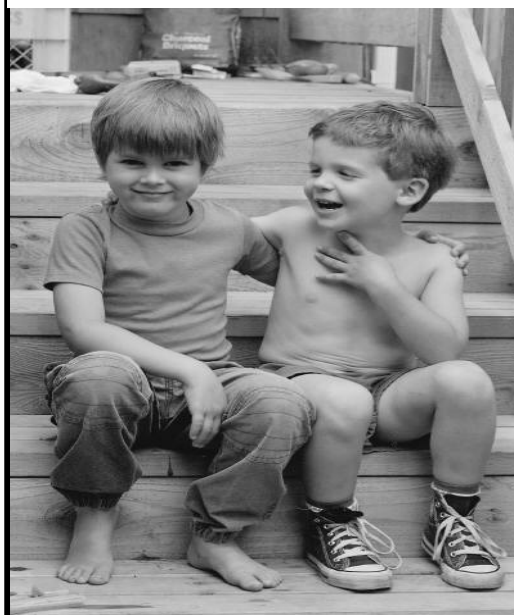

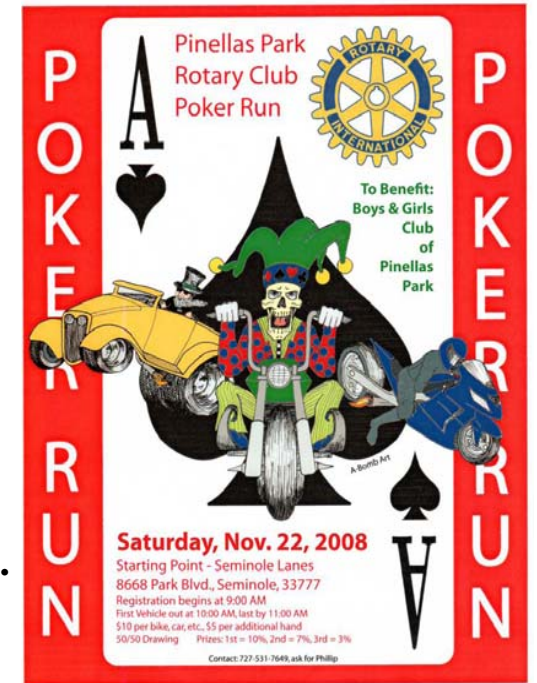

**Last Week's Program:** Chairman, **Jerry Krauss**, introduced **Carolyn Sironen**, a Nurse Practitioner in Dermatology since 2005. A graduate of Gibbs High School in 1983, she received her BSN from the University of Florida in 1988 and her MSN from the University of Tampa in 2001. **Carolyn** practices with Dr. Gary Heller on 66th Street in Pinellas Park and spoke on what their office does on a daily basis and gave us a general education on skin cancers. As a Nurse Practitioner in Florida, she works under her Doctor's license. There are many states where they are permitted to practice on their own. The most common dermatological complaints registered in her office are for dryness, bruising, itching, scaling, skin fragility and hair loss. More damage is done to the skin from sun exposure than chemicals or hormones. People are more apt to get skin damage in Florida because of our location in deference to the equator. Those working in high altitudes, like airline pilots, are also more prone to have skin problems. Those with fair complexions must be much more careful than people with dark complexions. **Carolyn** explained the different types of cancers that are treated in her office and how each is treated. The best advice she gave us was to ALWAYS use sun screen when outdoors and apply it often. Most importantly, any skin irregularity that is changing, whether in shape or color, should be looked at NOW.
