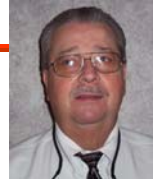

Dick is currently the Senior Advisor of Community Outreach for the Tampa Bay Rays & he heads up their Rays of Hope Foundation. Dick mainly spoke about the first weeks opening of the baseball season. He explained, in detail, his association with the members of the Armed Forces stationed at MacDill Air Force base and how he helped orchestrate the raising of the 2008 Eastern Division championship Banner and the American League Championship banner. He explained how the service members were placed in the catwalks high above the playing field well before any spectators entered the stadium. Then at the appropriate time, they propelled slowly downward holding the lines with the banners thereby allowing the banners to rise to the ceiling as the soldiers and sailors landed on the field. Food for Thought

Junk-food Junkies, repent. That's the gospel of Gopal Kapur, a project management expert and cooking columnist who has parsed the tangled way foodstuffs are processed, packaged and shipped from field to table. "We don't respect our abundance as much as we should." says Kapur, who has started up a web site to help people understand how most of the world's 6.7 billion people eat. The site, familygreensurvival.com, offers tips for two programs, designed to be followed for one day a month: Eating Green, in which participants eat only vegetables and fruits, nuts and seeds—locally grown when possible—and Survival Eating, which incorporates a limit of 800 to 1,400 calories aligned with the intake of the world's poor. For the 69-year old native of India, less is more. "If somebody says I have no time to cook, then I say eating green is just right for you.
